a) The answer options **doesn't know (DK)** and **no response (NA)** can be entered in the data entry software in three ways, depending on the form of the question:

1. For most questions, these options are not offered but can be entered with special key combinations. In the case of routing question, the * sign indicates the option with which the programme proceeds in case of a DK or NA code.
