Notes

- a) The answer options **doesn't know (DK)** and **no response (NA)** can be entered in the data entry software in three ways, depending on the form of the question:
 - 1. For most questions, these options are not offered but can be entered with special key combinations. In the case of routing question, the * sign indicates the option with which the programme proceeds in case of a DK or NA code.

Example:

- c) When asked about dates, respondents were offered the option to indicate **seasons** instead of months if they could not remember the exact month in which the event took place. Season codes: 13 spring, 14 summer, 15 autumn, 16 winter.


