



## *Generations & Gender Programme Newsletter*



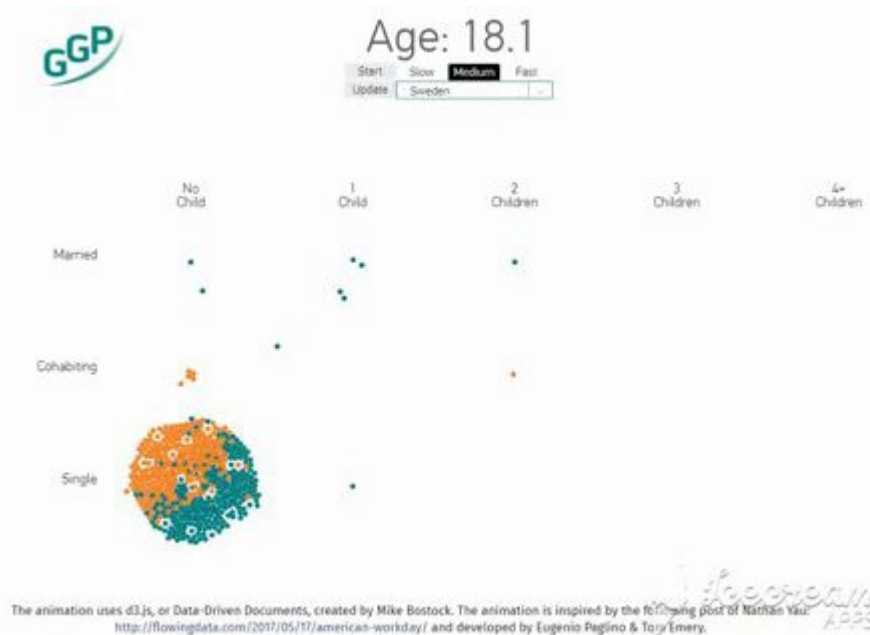

The GGP North Meeting took place in Stockholm on 29 November. The meeting was attended by delegates from Canada, Estonia, Finland, The Netherlands, Norway and Sweden. The meeting focused on how statistical offices fielding the GGS in 2020 will integrate administrative data collection and create more sustainable and high quality data.



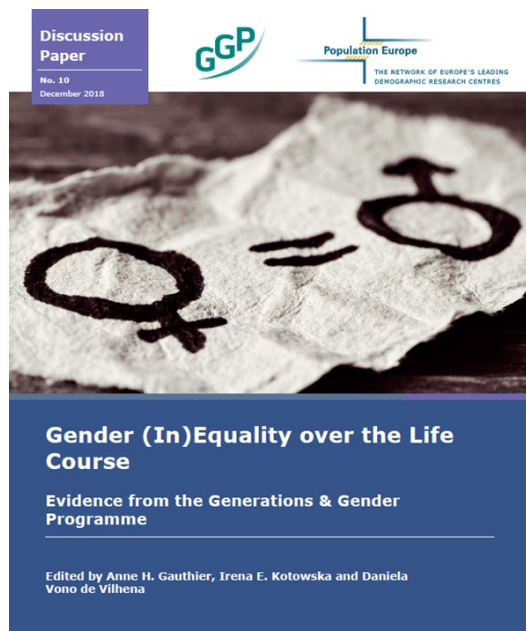
## ***First GGP Hackathon***



The first GGP Hackathon took place on 3-6 December at NIDI. The hackathon brought together researchers from the UK, Germany and the Netherlands. The aim was to expand the Harmonized Histories dataset by (1) adding new data from the UK, Canada and the Netherlands, and (2) updating the histories with data from wave 2 of the GGS.

## New GGP Discussion Paper

This collection of articles included in Population Europe's [Discussion Paper No. 10](#) captures the state-of-the-art research in the field of Gender (In)Equality based upon data from the GGP. The contributions present, in concise format, the key theories, socio-demographic trends and remaining questions regarding gender (in)equality across multiple domains of life. All of the articles draw their empirical evidence from data from the GGP.



## Moldova Planning Meeting



The GGP team welcomed a Moldovan delegation to NIDI to advance planning for the Moldovan GGS which will take place in 2019. This will be the first time

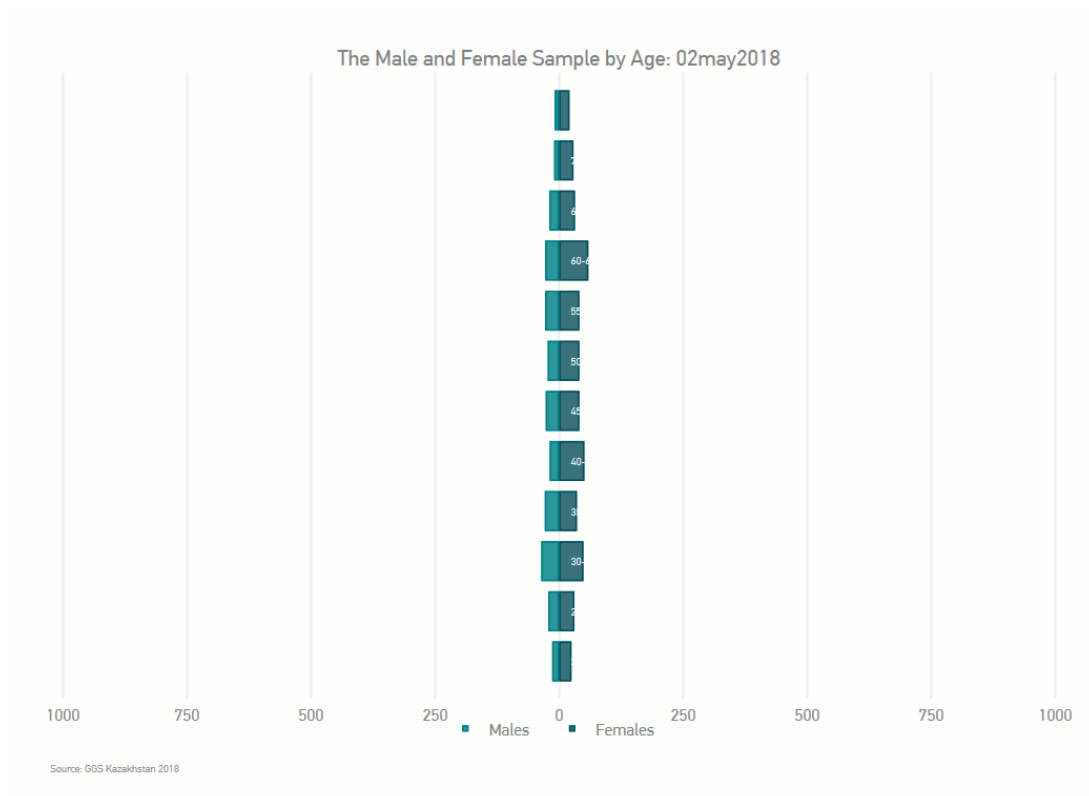
that the Statistical Office in Moldova will be conducting a survey using tablets and the team at NIDI will be providing support to its implementation. The survey data will be used to capture demographic trends in Moldova and develop policy advice on population issues.

## ***New Collaboration***



As part of a new Horizon 2020 project called the Social Science and Humanities Open Science Cloud (SSHOC), the GGP will be collaborating with linguists from CLARIN to extract and analyze linguistic data from interviews. The collaboration is expected to provide new insights into the data collected by the GGP and to provide CLARIN with high quality corpora for linguistic research. SSHOC is a €14 million initiative to support collaboration between the Social Science and Humanities Infrastructures and the European Open Science Cloud. Other participants include SHARE and ESS, with CESSDA in the lead.

## ***GGP Kazakhstan Complete***



Fieldwork in Kazakhstan has been completed with over 13,500 interviews completed in Russian and Kazakh. The Statistical Office and the UNFPA teams collaborated to deliver high quality and professional data collection. The data will be available for GGP users in spring 2019.
