### The GGP in SSHOC

January 2019 saw the start of the Social Science and Humanities Open Science Cloud project (Grant Number: 823782). This €14.5 million project seeks to better integrate Social Science and Humanities Infrastructures with the European Open Science Cloud. In this project, the GGP will be collaborating with the European Linguistics Infrastructure (CLARIN) and the European Value Study (EVS) to develop new approaches to harvesting linguistic data from survey interviews.



# Regional Workshop on the 2020 Round of the Generations & Gender Programme




On January 22 and 23, 2019, more than 40 participants from government, academia and national statistical agencies from countries across Eastern Europe and Central Asia participated in the Regional Workshop on the 2020 round of the Generations & Gender Programme in Chişinău, Republic of Moldova. The workshop commenced with the signing of a Statement of Collaboration to field the Generations & Gender Survey in Moldova by the Ministry of Health, Labour and Social Protection, the National Bureau of Statistics, UNFPA Moldova and the Generations & Gender Programme. Keynote speakers provided insight on the use of GGS data for evidence-informed policy and the practical steps required for fielding the GGS.
