"This paper uses data from the GGS Waves 1, and 2 (DOIs: 10.17026/dans-z5zxn8g, 10.17026/dans-xm6-a262), see <u>Gauthier, A. H. et al. (2018)</u> or visit the GGP website (<u>https://www.ggp-i.org/</u>) for methodological details."




5th GGP User Conference - Registration
