Kick-off for the Research Project FReDA 12.5 Million Euros for the yearly Family Demography Panel including GGS



The Federal Institute for Population Research (BiB), together with the Leibniz Institute for Social Sciences GESIS and the University of Cologne, are creating a new research basis for a better understanding of changes in family and demographic development. The project is funded by the Federal Ministry of Education and Research (BMBF) with 12.5 million euros until 2024. If the evaluation is positive, the Federal Ministry of the Interior, Building and Community (BMI) will ensure further funding.

FReDA – The German family demography panel includes the **Generation and Gender Survey (GGS)** every three years, as well as annual surveys among women and men between the ages of 18 and 49. Further, FReDA will continue the pairfamsample beginning in 2020 and will conduct partner-interviews. It pursues the goal of significantly improving and ensuring the long-term sustainability of research in Germany on changes in family and population development.

Inclusion of the Polish Infrastructure into the National Roadmap




20th Anniversary of the GGP

Update on the GGS2020 Fieldwork

The GGS fieldwork in Moldova is currently starting and it is expected to be concluded by April/ May. Moldova is the first country to field the new GGS2020 questionnaire. Preparations for the Asian GGS pilot in Hong Kong are also underway, with funding partially secured. Other countries – among them, Canada, France, Germany, Sweden – have also secured funding for fieldwork and will soon start the translation of the questionnaire using the Translation Management Tool.



User Syntax Combining GGS Wave 1 & GGS2020 Datasets

Based on the GGS2020 data from Belarus, Vytenis Juozas Deimantas developed a Stata syntax that allows for comparative studies between countries in GGS Wave 1 and GGS2020.
