Harmonized Histories Data - Spain



Thanks to the efforts of Ryohei Mogi (Center for Demographic Studies, Barcelona), Judith Koops (Netherlands Interdisciplinary Demographic Institute), and Karolin Kubisch (Max Planck Institute for Demographic Research), a new file has been added to the **Harmonized Histories** dataset:

- · Country: Spain
- · Year of data collection: 2018
- · N=17,175 (14,556 women and 2,619 men)

The Harmonized Histories is an international comparative dataset which focuses on **fertility and partnership histories**, but also captures information on the socio-economic status, place of residence, the childhood family, and other relevant demographics. In collaboration with the Data Archiving and Networked Services (DANS), the GGP is currently trying to find micro-level data and documentation for the **World Fertility Survey** of developed countries. The World Fertility Survey was conducted in the **1970s and 1980s**, however, for the majority of developed countries, the data is not accessible for researchers. Our goal is to locate these data and, where possible, archive the data at DANS and release them via GGP.

We are happy to announce that, with the help of our partners and colleagues, we have been able to locate micro-data of the following nine countries: Canada, Denmark, Finland, France, Hungary, Israel, Netherlands, Norway, Portugal, Sweden, the UK and the US. More information about these datasets will be added to our website in the coming months. We would be very thankful for any suggestions on finding the micro-data of the following 13 countries* :
