Funding for fieldwork secured in Czechia, Finland and the Netherlands



More countries received positive news regarding their funding applications and will be joining the new round of GGS data collection. In Czechia, Martin Kreidl and Martin Lakomý saw their application to the Technology Agency of the Czech Republic approved. In the case of Finland, the application by Anna Rotkirch to the Svenska Kulturfonden was also successful. In the Netherlands, funding for the GGS was secured via ODISSEI (Open Data Infrastructure for Social Science and Economic Innovations), the Dutch national research infrastructure for the Social Sciences. So far, Belarus, Canada, Czechia, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Hong Kong, Kazakhstan, Moldova, the Netherlands, Norway, Sweden and Uruguay have received either partial or full funding for the fieldwork.

How the pandemic affects fieldwork



As other research infrastructures, the GGS fieldwork has been affected by the current pandemic. Moldova started face-to-face interviews in February and had to halt fieldwork in March due to this situation. So far, approximately 3,000 interviews were collected and the national team plans to resume fieldwork as soon as it is safe to do so. The plans for the start date for fieldwork in other countries are also being reassessed. Despite the impact of the pandemic in fieldwork (in particular, face-to-face mode of data collection), the GGP and the countries planning to field the GGS will gather fundamental data to understand the intentions and challenges faced by individuals and families in these hard times.
