## Czech pilot data: available now!



We are pleased to announce that the data of the Czech GGS Covid pilot is available! The pilot was initiated as a complement to the main GGS study. It included the GGS core questionnaire and approximately 40 country-specific questions on economic uncertainty and the consequences of the Covid-19 pandemic. Data was collected online (CAWI only) during the period of December 2020 to February 2021, resulting in over 1300 cases.

### GSS in Sweden: The 5th GGP-connect webinar



At the first GGP-connect seminar after the summer break, **Gunnar Andersson** presented the GGS data collection carried out over 2020-2021 in Sweden.

The GGS was collected in Sweden to understand the **rapid fertility decline** that cannot be explained by conventional structural factors or other sources of data. The new round of the Swedish GGS included a shortened version of the GGS questionnaire, as well as **new modules** on perceived uncertainty, Covid-19 questions, and intensive parenting. A random sample of N = 30,000 people, ages 18-59, were approached. Apart from surveying the national sample, an additional immigrant sub-sample was collected among the five largest immigrant communities in the country. The response rate was 27 percent.

## A fellowship opportunity: Call for proposals

A fellowship opportunity is open for application. UNFPA Moldova jointly with the Ministry of Labour and Social Protection and the Netherlands Interdisciplinary Demographic Institute (NIDI) invites national and international researchers on demography, sociology, sexual reproductive health and rights, ageing, or gender equality to conduct targeted analysis based on GGS Moldovan microdata in order to support better understanding of demographic changes and their short and long-term impact on Moldovan society. Up to 5 national and 5 international researchers will be selected to conduct national or cross-national comparative analysis by using Moldovan microdata.

## Introducing two new GGP Taskforces



#### Introducing a new Questionnaire Task Force

• The GGP has a new Questionnaire Task Force for preparing the follow-up questionnaire. It consists of Monika Mynarska (UKSW) who acts as the chair, Detlev Lück (BiB), Zsuzsanna Makay (HDRI), and Laurent Toulemon (INED). Olga Grünwald (NIDI) and Marta Bryzek (UKSW) will support their work. The Task Force has just begun their work and will discuss possible approaches to the follow-up questionnaire with the Consortium Board and with the GGP Community in the next months. The goal is to finalize the preparatory stage and have the overall design of the follow-up questionnaire approved by the Consortium Board by the end of the year. Work on the questionnaire will continue in the first half of 2022, so it can be tested in the second half of the year, and be ready for fielding in 2023. #### Introducing a new Methods Group

• The GGP has a new **Methods Group** with as founding members Aat Liefbroer (NIDI), Peter Lugtig (UU), and Wojciech Jablonski (NIDI). The initial focus of the Methods Group will be to take stock of the large cross-national variation in the mode of data collection in the current round of GGS, and its impact on the data. Also, the Methods Group will be working on guidelines on accessing the representativeness of the data in GGS, as well as procedures that could boost it (e.g., unified strategy concerning weights).
