### ***GGP on ESFRI: Official launch on December 7!***



We are pleased to announce that the ESFRI Roadmap 2021, which includes the Generations and Gender Programme (GGP), will officially be launched on **December 7** via a half-day online conference.

The **ESFRI Roadmap** (European Strategy Forum on Research Infrastructures) is a strategic document that identifies vital research infrastructures in Europe. Its mission is to ensure a coherent and strategic approach to policy making. The official launch will include a comprehensive presentation and discussion of the ESFRI Roadmap 2021, followed by the presentation of **11 new Research Infrastructure Projects**, including the GGP, and will feature sessions on strategic research infrastructure policy challenges.

As one of ESFRI's Research Infrastructures, the GGP is supported in its aim to answer pressing scientific and societal questions on population and family dynamics and its accumulated data will continue to be a valuable resource for the Social Sciences in terms of research and policy making. The successful inclusion on the ESFRI Roadmap underlines the high standards the GGP has received in terms of scientific excellence and maturity.

## *Fieldwork update*



This month, France finished the preparations of its GGS pilot. The fieldwork of this pilot was launched on November 10. In the pilot, the experiment mode (CAWI and CATI) and incentive (none, €5 unconditional; €15 conditional; €5 unconditional + €15 conditional) were varied randomly. The GGS is currently also still in the field in three other countries: Uruguay (mixed mode design, CAPI and CAWI), Finland (CAWI only) and Estonia (CAWI only).

## *GGP-Connect: GGS in Denmark*

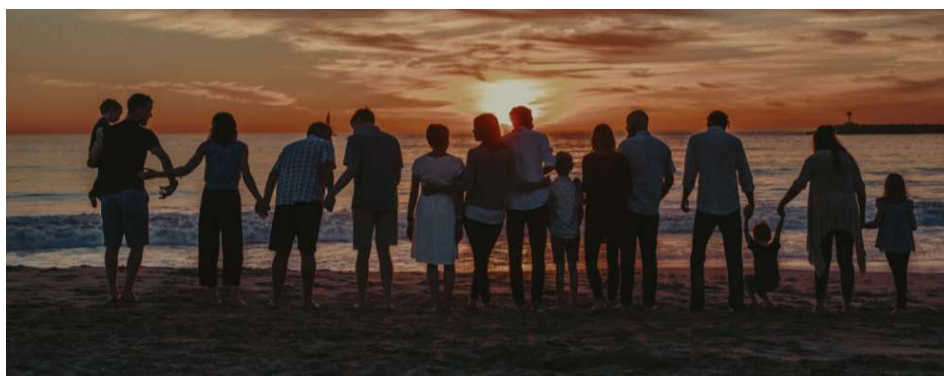


In the 7th GGP-connect webinar, which was held on November 23, **Lisbeth Loft** talked about the GGS in Denmark and provided insights on data collection, data access, and the quality of the data. In addition, the speaker presented some research questions the Danish team hopes to answer using the GGS .

The **Danish GGS** was carried out between March and June 2021 among an individual sampling frame representative of the 18 to 49 year-old legal residents of Denmark. The participants were invited through a national secured web portal and contacted a total of three times. Participants were offered incentives in the form of lottery prizes. The overall response rate was **24%**, resulting in a total of **N = 10,268** responses collected. Analyses were performed to evaluate the quality of the data. These showed that the **consistency** between the survey responses and administrative records is fairly high.

## ***GGP at international conferences***



### **GGP virtual booth at UNPFA conference on Demographic Resilience!**

- On **December 1 and December 2 2021**, high-level government representatives, leaders and experts from across Europe and Central Asia gathered onsite and online to discuss pathways for societies to thrive in a world of rapid demographic change. During this ministerial conference, called [Shaping Europe's Demographic Future](#), there was also an entirely virtual Demographic Resilience Expo where the Generations and Gender Programme (GGP) was presented via a virtual booth. In this booth, visitors had access to introductory videos about the GGP, learned how to get GGS in their country, and gained insights on the impact of the GGP via three case studies. In addition, visitors could chat with representatives from the GGP general hub.

### **Meeting on GGP and the Swiss Research Infrastructure Roadmap 2023**

- On **December 3 2021**, representatives of the University of Lausanne and the Swiss Centre of Expertise in the Social Sciences (FORS) came together with other scholars to discuss the establishment of the Generation and Gender Survey (GGS) in Switzerland as part of the Swiss Research Infrastructure Roadmap 2023. The application is currently in progress. The online meeting also included a keynote by prof. Anne Gauthier, the scientific director of the GGP. ### **Official launch of GGS in Moldova**

- On **December 8 2021**, from 10h00 to 13h00 (EET), the **official launch** of the GGS in Moldova is going to be held. The event is organized to officially present the results of the Moldovan GSS, the largest demographic survey in the republic of Moldova. To underline the relevance of the GGS for policy making, the event also includes an interview with the Minister of Labour and Social Protection and Chair of the Parliamentary Commission on Health, Social Protection and Family.
