The Generations and Gender Programme was well represented during the European Population Conference 2022, which took place in Groningen from

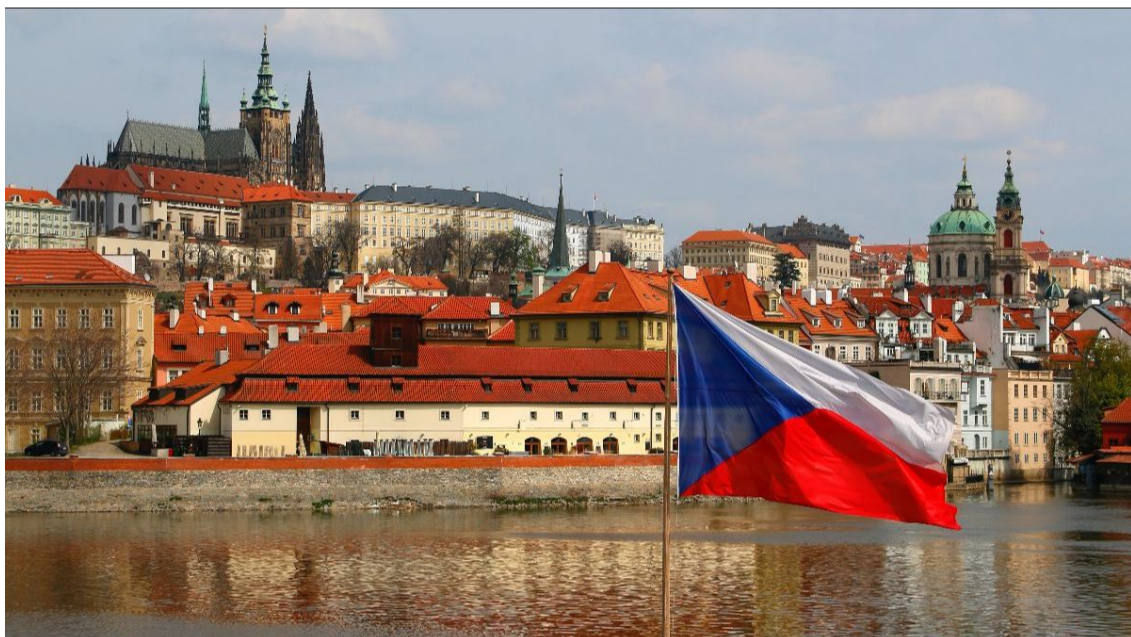
the 29th of June until the 2nd of July.

As an official conference sponsor, the GGP Central Hub was pleased to welcome and inform data users, members of national teams and other interested parties at our **exhibition booth**. A browse through the conference programme showed a total of **17 presentations or posters using GGS data**.

All conference attendees received the special EPC edition of Demos, which included an **article on young adults' views on gender equality** based on new GGS-II data. As the cherry on top we congratulate GGP Central Hub member Almut Schumann and her co-author Detlev Lück, for winning an **EPC2022 Poster Award**. Their poster titled 'Better Ask Online When it Concerns Intimate Relationships? Mode Differences in the Assessment of Relationship Quality' and used the GGP Pilot study (2018).

New data release: Czech GGS COVID Pilot Follow-up



At the end of 2020, the 'Czech GGS Covid pilot' was conducted using the GGS baseline questionnaire.

By Spring 2021, the pandemic situation in the Czech Republic had worsened. To compare the impact of the pandemic on reproductive behaviour, partner relationships, household arrangements and subjective health at different timepoints, the Czech national team decided to conduct a follow-up pilot study. They re-contacted all 1313 respondents who participated in the pilot study. The **questionnaire included new covid-specific questions and repeated selected questions from the main GGS study**. Data collection took place between 4 and 19 April 2021. In total 1187 of the original respondents completed the follow-up.

The data of the Czech GGS COVID pilot Follow-up are now available in the GGP Data Portal.
