COORDINATE project delivers first 'class' of international trainers



On September 15-16 the Generations and Gender Programme welcomed seven talented national champions at NIDI in the Hague. They joined a workshop offered within the <u>COORDINATE project</u>. The aim of the class was to learn how to communicate the benefits of longitudinal studies to people outside academia and research.

The first day of the training, participants worked together with **Daniela Vono de Vilhena**, Deputy Executive Secretary of <u>Population Europe</u>, in exploring, processing and planning their strategies for engaging non-scientific national stakeholders working in the field of age-group-specific well-being. The second part of the workshop was led by **Vytenis Juozas Deimantas**, GGP's Research Infrastructure Manager and focused on individual or group work.

The 'class' is now off to their respective countries to hold workshops making longitudinal data accessible, useful and relatable to national stakeholders.

Harmonized Histories for Denmark: Now available!

Thanks to the efforts of **Almut Schumann** (German Federal Institute of Population Research) a new file has been added to the Harmonized Histories dataset: **Denmark**

The new Harmonized Histories dataset is based on the **GGS data collection in Denmark from March until June 2021** as CAWI interviews. This dataset has a **sample size of 8,269** (4,610 women and 3,659 men) The Harmonized Histories dataset is an international comparative dataset that focuses on fertility and partnership histories. It also captures information on socioeconomic status, place of residence, childhood family, and other relevant demographics. The fertility and partnership biographies are available in a **standardized and user-friendly data format**. By now this dataset covers a wide range of 25 countries around the globe and captures information of over 370,000 individuals in total.

Fielding a GGS to get to know the city of Buenos Aires: Watch it now!



The thirteenth webinar of the GGP-Connect seminar series, which was held on the 20th of September at 14:00 (CEST), hosted a speaker from the Buenos Aires Statistics Bureau in Argentina. Fieldwork operations to conduct a GGS in the city of Buenos Aires started in September 2022 and are ongoing.

In her talk **Marisa Miodosky** spoke about 'Fielding a Gender and Generation Survey in Buenos Aires: First steps towards comparing this city with main European Countries'. In terms of demographic developments, the city of Buenos Aires shows similarities to various European countries. It faces low fertility, population ageing and low population growth. This observation motivated the Buenos Aires Statistics Bureau to join the Generations and Gender Programme and field a GGS. **The topics within the GGS align well with the local government's policy agenda which prioritizes issues related to gender and youth.** A team of experienced interviewers is committed to collecting high-quality comparative data. The Buenos Aires regional team is open to collaborations with the wider GGP community, for instance via joined publications. Fieldwork update



Fieldwork in Buenos Aires (CAPI) started a month ago and is going well. In Uruguay fieldwork (CAPI & CAWI) is ongoing and expected to be finished by the end of November. The UK national team sent out invitation letters in the last week of September, in this country all interviews will be in CAWI mode. Fieldwork in Austria, Hong Kong, the Netherlands and the pilot in Taiwan will start soon.
