Successful Launch of GGS-II UK



The UK GGS team is delighted to announce the successful **launch of the first UK GGS dataset**, Wave 1 of GGS-II, on January 19th, 2024, led by Principal Investigator Professor Brienna Perelli-Harris. The launch event, held at the Coram Group in central London, was attended by 40 guests from academic institutions, the civil service, and third-party stakeholders. Professor Perelli-Harris, along with Co-Investigators Dr. Olga Maslovskaya and Professor Ann Berrington, hosted the event, offering insights into the policy applications of GGS-II UK and its scientific contributions, as well as providing a platform for networking among users.

Expert speakers from GGP, including Director Professor Anne Gauthier and Dr. Arieke Rijken, provided an overview of the GGP and discussed the methodological advancements of GGS-II. During the event, Dr. Maslovskaya and Dr. Grace Chang led and presented the **methodological contributions** of GGS-II UK, which included experiments with incentives, assessments of representativeness, and the feasibility of conducting an extensive survey. The event also featured early substantive UK **findings on fertility intentions and childcare**, shared by Professor Ann Berrington and Dr. Bernice Kuang, along with policy briefs on both topics, available online <u>here</u> and <u>here</u>. The event closed with a new showcase of the cross-national use of GGS for studying cohabitation by Professor Martin Kreidl, coordinator of the GGS Czechia project.

GGP-5D Project Progress Review



On January 22, 2024, the **GGP-5D project conducted its first periodic review** with the European Commission (EC). The EC's Project Officer, Blagovesta Cholova, and external expert Mariana Damova thoroughly assessed the progress in each work package and the overall project development. The evaluation yielded **highly positive results for GGP-5D**.

Project partners showcased **significant achievements** in the first year across various aspects. In the realm of **technical excellence**, Laurent Toulemon from INED presented work on FAIR data opportunities for GGP, along with a technical paper on the mixed mode of GGS data collection.

Monika Mynarska from the Warsaw School of Economics covered the **scientific and socio-economic impact**, highlighting the launch of the first call for user-suggested survey questions in GGS and the successful organization of the 7th GGP User Conference in Warsaw.

Stefanie Hoherz from BiB presented progress on the **financial sustainability** of the GGP, sharing achieved goals and outlining plans for the GGP's Costbook and Business plan. Vytenis Deimantas from GGP CCT reported advancements in preparing **future ERIC statutes** of the GGP within the legal frameworks section.

Zsuzanna Makay from the Hungarian Demographic Research Institute discussed the **positioning of the GGP within the research infrastructure landscape**, sharing results from the GGP Consortium Board questionnaire on social sciences research infrastructures' synergies.

Letizia Mencarini from Bocconi University provided insights into the **strategic partnership** domain, reporting on the preparation for the initial meeting of the GGP Board of Governmental Representatives.

Updates from the GGP Central Hub



Fieldwork in **Taiwan** (CAWI + CAPI, age 18 to 69) has been underway since the beginning of January 2024. So far, there are 3,105 completed interviews with many more to be conducted in the next few weeks. Data collection for GGS-II wave 1 in **France** is set to commence in the coming weeks after a successful pilot was conducted in 2021-2022 and additional testing last fall.
