COORDINATE & GUIDE Meeting in Zagreb



On 4 and 5 March Öykü Akın, Vytenis Deimantas, and Julia Rokos from the GGP Central Coordination Team travelled to Zagreb, Croatia to participate in the **last COORDINATE consortium meeting and the GUIDE (Growing Up In Digital Europe) conference** titled Child Wellbeing: Longitudinal Evidence for Research and Policy.

The meetings included **updates on the various work packages** as well as a reflection on and **celebration of the last four years of the COORDINATE project.** The conference then focused on the **future and impact of GUIDE** as well as the first insights gained through the various work packages of the COORDINATE project. Within the COORDINATE project the **GGP team was involved in multiple work packages** focused on, among other things, establishing a remote data access environment and providing training and outreach opportunities to various stakeholders. **The GGP also was the top institution for the COORDINATE Transnational Access Visits**, receiving 33 visitors in total!

Infra4NextGen Consortium Meeting in Tilburg



The 2nd **Infra4NextGen Consortium meeting** took place on March 18-19 at Tilburg University, home to the European Values Study.

The event highlighted significant progress made in the project's first year, driven by a **collaboration of over 30 institutions, including GGP.** Upcoming milestones include the release of **inventories of survey items** from major cross-national surveys, as well as **data from the CROss-National Online Survey 3 (CRONOS-3) Panel.** These efforts focus on key themes of the NextGeneration EU recovery plan: Digital, Equal, Green, Health, and Strong.

Updates from the GGP Central Hub



Fieldwork: GGS-II Wave 1 (Baseline questionnaire)

Data collection in Taiwan was concluded on the 14th of March, with over 3,000 CAPI interviews and over 4,900 completed CAWI interviews. Fieldwork preparations are also ongoing for many countries such as Iceland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland and South Korea. Italy will be the next country going into the field in April.

Fieldwork: GGS-II Wave 2 (Follow-up questionnaire)

Czechia is currently in the field, with over 1,800 conducted interviews in CAWI mode. **Estonia also began data collection** at the beginning of March with over 3,300 conducted interviews in CAWI.

Data processing

Data processing is underway for **France** and **Taiwan** (Baseline questionnaire), with **France scheduled for release in the coming weeks**. Additionally, **Moldova** (Follow-up questionnaire) is being finalised, with a **launch event planned for September.**
